# Session #2: "THE BREAD OF LIFE" — Leviticus 2:1-16

Note: Reference has been made in the following notes and outline to commentaries on Leviticus by David Hocking,, Pastor Chuck Smith, J. Vernon McGee and Jon Courson.

- \*\*\*\*\*Questions: To whom or what do all of the sacrifices point us to? –The offerings speak of the person of Christ and the work of Christ. The burnt offering was a picture of Christ in depth as well as in death. The grain offering reveals the humanity of Jesus in all it perfection and loveliness.
- What is the reason/s for the need to use "fine" flour? v. 1
- Is oil to be poured on it or is it to be baked with the flour? -v. 4&5 "mixed"; v. 6 "pour"; v. 7 "with"
- Is frankincense used on the portion of the offering eaten by the priests?
- v. 11 Why is no leaven or honey to be burned on the altar?

The Hebrew name of the book wayyiqra which means "And He called" points to the fact that the theme of the whole book is a "Call to Holiness."

The key verses: Leviticus 11:44-45; 19:2 - "Be holy, for I am holy" - a phrase that is used 8 times in the Bible; the word "holy" used 91 times in the book; the word "cleansing" used 71 times, and references to that which is "unclean" are found 128 times. The phrase, "the Holy One of Israel" is found 30 times in Isaiah alone.

King David divided the Levites into 24 courses or divisions (*1 Chronicles 23:6*) - every priest was a Levite, but not all Levites are priests - other Levites were "assistants" to the priests. The gold plate on the turban of the High Priest said "Holiness to the Lord".

What is recorded in Leviticus covers about one month. The book attributes more of its material to God as the speaker than any other book of the Bible - <u>38 times</u>. – A call from God to us to be holy! The phrase "*I am the LORD*" appears <u>46 times</u> in the book.

#### **OUR WAY TO GOD IS BY SACRIFICE** - Leviticus 1-16

- ❖ 1A. THE **REQUIREMENTS** OF SACRIFICE LEVITICUS 1-7
  - ➤ 1B. OUR **DEDICATION** TO GOD Leviticus 1-2; 6:8-23

Three offerings: burnt offering, meal offering, and the drink offering.

- 1C. It is the <u>PRESENTATION</u> to God <u>of all that we are and have</u> "burnt offering" cf. Lev. 1:1-17; 6:8-23; Romans 12:1-2 (We are all priests because of what Jesus has done for us!)
- 2C. It is the <u>PROOF</u> that <u>we are thankful to God for all that He has provided for us</u> "meal offering" or "the meat offering or "grain offering" Lev. 2:1-16; 6:14-23 cf. Num 28:1-9 How much today are you thankful for?
- 3C. It is the <u>PICTURE</u> of a life "poured out" in <u>service to the Lord</u> "drink offering" cf. Leviticus 23:13, 18, 37; Numbers 15:1-13; 29:6, 11, 18-19
  "Poured out" cf. Psalm 22:14; Isaiah 53:12 (NIV) cf. Phil. 2:17; 2 Timothy 4:6 (NIV) 10
- ➤ 2B. OUR <u>**DEPENDENCY**</u> UPON GOD *Leviticus 3; 7:11-38* The <u>peace offering</u>.
- ➤ 3B. OUR <u>**DELIVERANCE**</u> BY GOD *Leviticus 4-5; 6:1-7, 24-30; 7:1-10* The <u>sin and trespass offerings.</u>
- ❖ 1A. THE **IDENTITY** OF THIS OFFERING Basically bread!

Hebrew *minchah* used 211 times, 34 times in Leviticus, 12 times in chapter 2.

Refers to a bloodless offering usually, but is used of Cain and Abel's offerings in *Genesis 4* - <u>offered with</u> blood sacrifices – cf. *Leviticus 23:18; Ezra 7:17*.

It is basically an offering of flour and oil (bread) and prepared in three possible ways:

- ➤ 1B. **BAKED** in an oven
- ➤ 2B. **FRIED** on a griddle
- $\rightarrow$  3B. **COOKED** in a pan

The priests offer it when they are anointed for service, but they don't eat it when they offer it for themselves.

The "memorial portion" was burned on the altar - <u>no one was to eat any part of the memorial</u> portion; the rest was given to the priests, and only the males would eat it, and eat it only in the "holy place."

### ❖ 2A. THE **INGREDIENTS** OF THIS OFFERING

Lev 2:1 "When anyone offers a grain (minchah) offering (qorban) to the LORD, his offering (qorban) shall be of fine flour. And he shall pour oil on it, and put frankincense on it.

Lev 2:2 He shall bring it to Aaron's sons, the priests, one of whom shall take from it his handful of fine flour and <u>oil</u> <u>with all the frankincense</u>. And the priest shall burn it as a <u>memorial</u> on the altar, an offering made by fire, a sweet aroma to the LORD.

- ➤ 1B. Fine flour 1-2 Hebrew *soleth equal* to "without blemish" in the case of animals.
- > 2B. Olive oil 1 "pour oil upon it" Oil represents the Holy Spirit v. 4&5 "mixed" born of the Spirit (Luke 1:35); v. 6 "pour" baptized/led of the Spirit (Mt. 3:16-17; Mk. 1:12); v. 7 "with" taught/performed miracles/offered Himself (John 3:34; Mt. 12:28)
- ➤ 3B. Frankincense 2 This incense seems to be added only on the "memorial portion" "with <u>all</u> the frankincense"
- Lev 2:11 "No grain offering which you bring to the LORD shall be made with leaven, for you shall burn <u>no leaven</u> nor any honey in any offering to the LORD made by fire.
- ➤ 4B. No leaven (yeast) or honey allowed 11 The "honey" was probably the honey of dates rather than from bees. No fermentation or decay here whatsoever! It illustrates the beauty and perfection of our Lord!

  Lev 2:13 And every offering of your grain offering you shall season with salt; you shall not allow the salt of the covenant of your God to be lacking from your grain offering. With all your offerings you shall offer salt.
  - ➤ 5B. Salt used in every grain offering 13 *Numbers 18:19* provides <u>seasoning</u> and <u>preservation</u>. The covenant with God is sealed with salt. *cf. Mt. 5:13; <u>Col. 4:6</u>* (Christian grace)

#### ❖ 3A. THE **INVOLVEMENT** OF THE PRIESTS IN THIS OFFERING - 2

Lev 2:2 <u>He shall bring it to Aaron's sons, the priests</u>, one of whom shall take from it his handful of fine flour and oil with all the frankincense. And <u>the priest shall burn it as a memorial on the altar</u>, an offering made by fire, a sweet aroma to the LORD.

"and he shall bring it to Aaron's sons the priests... "the priest shall burn it as a memorial on the altar". Hebrew word for "memorial" is 'azkarah which means "remembrance" and is used 7 times in the O.T., 6 of them in Leviticus, the other in Numbers 5:26.

The priests (Aaron and his sons) will eat the "*remnant*" of the offering (The amount to be given as a memorial was not specified by God, but apparently was determined by the priests. <u>How much would you</u> joyfully give/take?)

NIV/NKJV – "rest" NASB - "remainder" v. 3 - "it is a thing most holy of the offerings of the LORD made by fire" - cf. v. 10

It is to be eaten in the "holy place" (Lev. 6:16) All the "males" eat it (Lev. 6:18) They are to offer this same grain offering the day they are anointed for their ministry as priests - Lev. 6:20 - and they are not to eat any part of this offering at the time of their anointing - Lev. 6:23.

#### ❖ 4A. THE **INSIGHTS** ABOUT THIS OFFERING

- ▶ 1B. It points to the <u>PERSON</u> of our Lord Jesus Christ He is the <u>"Bread of Life"</u> <u>John 6:35</u>, <u>47-51</u>,
   58. This grain offering most definitely points to our Lord Jesus Christ!
- > 2B. It involves **PURITY** "fine flour" and no "leaven" or "honey"
- > 3B. It illustrates <u>PRAYER -</u> The "memorial portion" is the 'azkarah upon which (v. 2) "<u>all</u> the frankincense" is put cf. Exodus 30:34. It is used in <u>Acts 10:4</u>. "memorial before God". It is connected and illustrates prayer. (the Greek word in the LXX) to refer to the prayers and alms of Cornelius. Cf. Psalm 141:2; Revelation 5:8.
- → 4B. It pictures the <u>POWER</u> of the Holy Spirit v. 1 "pour oil on it" (anointing) cf. <u>Isa. 61:1; 1</u>
  <u>John 2:20; James 4:8.</u> Oil represents the Holy Spirit v. 4&5 "mixed"- <u>born</u> of the Spirit (<u>Luke 1:35</u>); v. 6 "pour" <u>baptized/led</u> of the Spirit (<u>Mt. 3:16-17; Mk. 1:12</u>); v. 7 "with" <u>taught/performed miracles/offered Himself</u> (John 3:34; Mt. 12:28)
- > 5B. It emphasizes PRESERVATION salt Matthew 5:13 "salt of the earth"
- ► 6B. It includes <u>PROVISION</u> for God's priests *Matt. 6:11* "<u>Give us this day our daily bread</u>" Are you offering a "memorial" portion to the Lord for all that He has done for you?

#### ❖ 5A. THE **IMPORTANCE** OF THIS OFFERING

Lev 2:2 He shall bring it to Aaron's sons, the priests, one of whom shall take from it his handful of fine flour and oil with all the frankincense. And the priest <u>shall burn it as a memorial on the altar</u>, an offering made by fire, a <u>sweet</u> aroma to the LORD.

Lev 2:9 Then the priest shall take from the grain offering a memorial portion, and <u>burn it on the altar. It is an offering made by fire</u>, a <u>sweet aroma to the LORD</u>.

Lev 2:16 Then the priest shall <u>burn the memorial portion</u>: part of its beaten grain and part of its oil, with all the frankincense, as **an offering made by fire to the LORD**.

- > 1B. The <u>APPROVAL</u> of God 2 "<u>shall burn it</u> as a memorial on the altar" v. 9 "burn it on the altar. It is an offering made by fire" <u>Does the approval of God rise up from your living sacrifice?</u> v. 16 "burn the memorial portion...an offering made by fire to the LORD"
- > 2B. The <u>ACCEPTANCE</u> of the LORD 2 "sweet aroma to the LORD" also v. 9 <u>Does your life</u> bring a sweet aroma to the Lord? Is there a thankful heart? Is there proof in your life that you're grateful for everything that God has done?

3B. The Drink Offering - (In addition to the Burnt and Grain offerings) - It is the PICTURE of a life "poured out" in service to the Lord - "drink offering" - cf. Leviticus 23:13, 18, 37; Numbers 15:1-13; 29:6, 11, 18-19; Gen. 35:14(Jacob); Ex. 29:40-41 (Daily Offerings).
 "Poured out" - cf. Psalm 22:14; Isaiah 53:12 (NIV) - cf. Used for us as believers! - Phil. 2:17; 2
 Timothy 4:6 - Keep on keeping on!!

### Lev 2:1 The Grain Offering

# The Grain Offering

- "When anyone offers a grain offering (minchah) to the LORD, his offering (qorban) shall be of fine flour. And he shall pour oil on it, and put frankincense on it.
- Lev 2:2 He shall bring it to Aaron's sons, the priests, one of whom shall take from it his handful of fine flour and oil with all the frankincense. And the priest shall burn it as a memorial on the altar, an offering (isseh) made by fire, a sweet aroma to the LORD.
- Lev 2:3 The rest of the grain offering (minchah) shall be Aaron's and his sons'. It is most holy of the offerings (isseh) to the LORD made by fire.
- Lev 2:4 "And if you bring as an offering a grain offering (minchah) baked in the oven, it shall be unleavened cakes of fine flour mixed with oil, or unleavened wafers anointed with oil.
- Lev 2:5 But if your offering (qorban) is a grain offering (minchah) baked in a pan, it shall be of fine flour, unleavened, mixed with oil.
- Lev 2:6 You shall break it in pieces and pour oil on it; it is a grain offering(minchah).
- Lev 2:7 "If your offering (qorban) is a grain offering (minchah) baked in a covered pan, it shall be made of fine flour with oil.
- Lev 2:8 You shall bring the grain offering (minchah) that is made of these things to the LORD. And when it is presented to the priest, he shall bring it to the altar.
- Lev 2:9 Then the priest shall take from the grain offering(minchah) a memorial portion, and burn it on the altar. It is an offering (isseh) made by fire, a sweet aroma to the LORD.
- Lev 2:10 And what is left of the grain offering (minchah) shall be Aaron's and his sons'. It is most holy of the offerings(isseh) to the LORD made by fire.
- Lev 2:11 "No grain offering (minchah) which you bring to the LORD shall be made with leaven, for you shall burn no leaven nor any honey in any offering (isseh) to the LORD made by fire.
- Lev 2:12 As for the offering(qorban) of the firstfruits, you shall offer them to the LORD, but they shall not be burned on the altar for a sweet aroma.
- Lev 2:13 And every offering (qorban) of your grain offering (minchah) you shall season with salt; you shall not allow the salt of the covenant of your God to be lacking from your grain offering(minchah). With all your offerings (qorban) you shall offer salt.
- Lev 2:14 "If you offer a grain offering (minchah) of your firstfruits to the LORD, you shall offer for the grain offering (minchah) of your firstfruits green heads of grain roasted on the fire, grain beaten from full heads.
- Lev 2:15 And you shall put oil on it, and lay frankincense on it. It is a grain offering(minchah).
- Lev 2:16 Then the priest shall burn the memorial portion: part of its beaten grain and part of its oil, with all the frankincense, as an offering (isseh) made by fire to the LORD.
