- ❖ OUR <u>WAY</u> TO GOD IS BY <u>SACRIFICE</u> Leviticus 1-16 -OUR <u>WALK WITH</u> GOD IS BY SANCTIFICATION - Leviticus 17-27
- ❖ 1A. THE **REQUIREMENTS** OF SACRIFICE LEVITICUS 1-7
 - ➤ 1B. OUR <u>DEDICATION</u> TO GOD Leviticus 1-2; 6:8-23 Three offerings: <u>burnt offering (all was burned on the altar)</u>, <u>meal offering (a portion was a memorial to the LORD</u>, the rest to the priests), and the drink offering.
 - 1C. It is the **Presentation** to God **of all that we are and have** "burnt offering"
 - 2C. It is the <u>Proof</u> that <u>we are thankful to God</u> for all that He has provided for us "*meal offering*" Lev. 2:1-16; 6:14-23
 - 3C. It is the <u>Picture</u> of a <u>life "poured out" in service</u> to the Lord "drink offering" cf. Leviticus 28:13, 18, 37; Numbers 15:1-13; 9:6, 11, 18-19
 - ➤ 2B. OUR <u>DEPENDENCY</u> UPON GOD *Leviticus 3; 7:11-39*The <u>peace offering</u> our offering thanksgiving to the LORD the <u>only offering which is eaten by the one</u> offering the sacrifice.
 - ➤ 3B. OUR <u>DELIVERANCE</u> BY GOD *Leviticus 4-5; 6:1-7, 24-30; 7:1-10* The sin and trespass offerings

The Hebrew word **shelem** is used 75 times in the Bible, of which 30 times are found in the book of Leviticus. It is called a **peace** offering or a **fellowship offering** or a **thanksgiving** offering.

The word "oblation" is the Hebrew qorban, (Mark 7:10-13) and the word "sacrifice" is the Hebrew word zebach, used 161 times, 35 of which are in Leviticus.

- ❖ 1A. THE **PRESENTATION** OF THIS OFFERING TO GOD
 - v. 1 "he shall offer it .. before the LORD"
 - v. 3 "he shall offer .. an offering made by fire unto the LORD"
 - v. 7 "he shall offer it before the LORD"
 - v. 9 "he shall offer .. an offering made by fire unto the LORD"
 - v. 12 "he shall offer it before the LORD"
 - v. 14 "he shall offer .. an offering made by fire unto the LORD"

Leviticus 7:30 - "<u>His own hands</u> (voluntarily)shall bring the offering made by fire to the LORD." Consider example of Solomon when dedicating the temple - he offered 142,000 peace offerings – cf. 1 Kings 8:62-66

- ❖ 2A. THE **POSSIBILITIES** FOR THIS OFFERING
 - ➤ 1B. OF THE <u>HERD</u> (bull, oxen, cow) 1-5 (<u>CHRIST AS SERVANT</u> to serve!)
 - 1C. Male or female Galatians 3:28
 - 2C. Without blemish Ephesians 1:4; 5:27
 - ➤ 2B. OF THE **FLOCK** (lamb or sheep)- 6-11 (<u>CHRIST AS **SACRIFICE**</u> to give His life!)

- 1C. Male or female
- 2C. Without blemish
- ➤ 3B. A <u>GOAT</u> 12-16 (<u>CHRIST AS SIN-BEARER -Lev. 16</u> outside the camp bears our sin!) Note: Birds too small for such a festive meal the poor were invited <u>to share with others</u> in their peace offerings. (Are you sharing in time of need?)

❖ 3A. THE **PROCESS** USED IN THE SACRIFICE - 2, 8, 13

- ➤ 1B. "<u>lay his hand upon the head</u> of his offering" Perhaps to express the purpose of his offering. Chap. 7 Thanksgiving? A vow?
- > 2B. "<u>kill it</u> before the tabernacle of the congregation" Reminds us of our relationship w God.
- ➤ 3B. "<u>sprinkle the blood</u> upon the altar round about" cf. Heb. 9:22 requires the work of a Mediator (priest) What a picture or our Lord!

❖ 4A. THE **PRINCIPLE** CONCERNING THE FAT

Psalm 36:8 - "They are abundantly satisfied with the fullness (fatness) of Your house, And You give them drink from the river of Your pleasures.

Genesis 45:18 (Pharaoh to Joseph) - "... I will give you the best of the land of Egypt, and you will eat the fat of the land."

Deuteronomy 32:13-14 - speaking about the Lord's blessings upon His people - "He made him ride in the heights of the earth, that he might eat the produce of the fields; He made him draw honey from the rock, And oil from the flinty rock; Curds from the cattle, and milk of the flock, With fat of lambs; And rams of the breed of Bashan, and goats, With the choicest wheat; And you drank wine, the blood of the grapes."

- ➤ 1B. It was **to be burned** on the altar 5, 11, 16
- > 2B. It was a sweet savor unto the Lord 5, 16
- > 3B. All the fat is the Lord's 16

❖ 5A. THE **PROHIBITION** CONCERNING FAT & BLOOD – 17

"a <u>perpetual statute</u> for your generations throughout all your dwellings, that ye eat neither fat nor blood - cf. <u>Leviticus 7:22-27</u>; Deut. 12:16, 23, 25; 15:33; 1 Samuel 14:32-35; Ezk. 44:15; Acts 15:20, 28-29, 31.

❖ 6A. THE **PORTION** GIVEN TO THE PRIEST – **7:30-36**

- ➤ 1B. The Breast (love and tender care) heart of God They waved it before the Lord!
- ➤ 2B. The Shoulder (the place of strength) strength of God

❖ 7A. THE **PURPOSE** OF THE PEACE OFFERING

- ➤ 1B. To **RETURN** thanks for all God has done *Heb.* 13:15-16
- ➤ 2B. To **REVEAL** the Lord as our peace offering *Eph. 2:11-18; Col 1:19-20*
- > 3B. To **REMIND** us of our need of peace *Phil. 4:6-7, 9; Col. 3:15; John 14:1; Eph. 4:3; Rom. 12:18*

"Like a river glorious, is God's perfect peace, Over all victorious, in its bright increase;

Perfect, yet it floweth, fuller every day, Perfect, yet it groweth, deeper all the way.
