## Principle #3 - SANCTIFICATION - 6:1-7:25

1A. OUR **REALIZATION** OF CERTAIN FACTS - ROMANS 6:1-10(dead to sin-alive to God) 2A. OUR **RESPONSIBILITY** TO THESE FACTS - ROMANS 6:11-23 (present-yield; obey)

- <u>3A. OUR RELATIONSHIP TO THE LAW ROMANS 7:1-25</u> "*law*" - 523 times; 223 in NT, 148 by Paul of which 78 are in Romans - 23 in chapter 7 alone! 1B. The **ILLUSTRATION** of marriage - 7:1-6
- <u>2B. The INSTRUCTION of the law 7:7- (Why the Law?)</u> 3B. The **IMPOSSIBILITY** of keeping the law - 7:15-25 (The Problem of Sin)

"What shall we say then?" –

6:1 - the issue of grace (cf. 5:20);

6:15 - the issue of freedom (cf. v. 14);

<u>7:7</u> - the <u>issue of sin</u> - <u>If the inclination to sin comes through the law</u> as implied in 7:5, then <u>isn't the law something sinful?</u> A second question will arise when we come to v. 13 - the point being, if the law is as he says in v. 12, that the law is holy, just and good, then <u>why can't the law</u> <u>make us holy?</u>

## Why the Law?:

- 1C. <u>The law Removes our ignorance of sin</u> 7
- 2C. The law stirs up or Revives our sinful desires 8-9, 11
- 3C. The law Requires the penalty of death 10
- 4C. The law Reflects the character of God Himself 12 -
- 5C. The law Reminds us of how terrible sin is 13
- 6C. The law Reveals our carnality 14
- 7C. The law Reinforces our need of a Savior 14

Rom 7:7 What shall we say then? Is the law sin? <u>Certainly not!</u> On the contrary, I <u>would not have known sin except through the law</u>. For I <u>would not have</u> <u>known covetousness (desire, craving, lust) unless</u> the law had said, "You shall not covet." 1C. <u>The law Removes our ignorance of sin</u> – 7

cf. <u>Rom. 3:19-20; 1 John 3:4.</u> The problem of "covetousness" or "lust" - Greek: epithumia - noun appears 38 times and the verb another 16 times. Consider the following usages: <u>Matthew 5:27-28; John 8:44; Romans 1:24; 6:12; 13:14; 1 Cor. 10:6; Gal. 5:16-17; Col. 3:5 (same as idolatry); 1 Thess. 4:5; 2 Tim. 2:22; James 1:13-15; 1 Pet. 2:2,11; 1 John 2:15-17</u>

## Rom 7:8 But sin, **taking opportunity** (occasion) by the commandment, **produced** in me all manner of evil desire. For apart from the law sin was dead.

Rom 7:9 I was alive once without the law, but when the commandment came, sin revived and I died.

2C. <u>The law stirs up or Revives our sinful desires</u> - 8-9, 11

1D. Sin stirs the evil desires, NOT the law - 8a

2D. Sin stays hidden and unknown without the teaching of God's law -8b - "For apart from the law, sin was dead"

*Rom* 7:11 *For sin, taking occasion* (opportunity)*by the commandment, deceived me, and by it killed me.* 

3D. <u>Sin slays us by using the law</u> – 11 - 8, 11 - "taking occasion" NIV - "seizing the opportunity" NAS - "taking the opportunity" Greek: aphormen - 7 times - cf. <u>Gal. 5:13</u> or <u>1</u> <u>Tim. 5:14</u> "deceived me" - cf. <u>1 Cor. 10:12; 2 Cor. 11:3</u>

Rom 7:10 And the commandment, which was to bring life, I found to bring death. 3C. <u>The law Requires the penalty of death</u> – 10 - cf. <u>Lev. 18:5</u> and <u>Ecc. 7:20</u> <u>"shall surely be put</u> <u>to death"</u> - 28 times! Heb. 10:28 - "He that despised Moses' law died without mercy under two or three witnesses"

Rom 7:12 Therefore the law is holy, and the commandment holy and just and good.
4C. The law Reflects the character of God Himself – 12 - Paul calls it "the law of God" - Rom.
7:22, 25; 8:7 Jesus referred to it as "the commandment of God" (Matt. 15:3, 6). He is the Law! It's His Law.

1D. It is not sinful at all - "holy"

2D. It is fair in what it demands - "just" Our God is a fair God!!

3D. It is beneficial to us - "good" - It protects our lives, property, families and our society.

Rom 7:13 Has then what is good become death to me? Certainly not! <u>But sin, that it</u> <u>might appear sin</u>, was producing death in me through what is good, so that sin through the commandment <u>might become exceedingly sinful</u>.

5C. The <u>law Reminds us of how terrible sin is</u> – 13 He wants this to be understood by His people, <u>not to use the law to change us</u>, <u>but to drive us to Christ!</u>

Rom 7:14 For we know that **the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin.** 

6C. <u>The law Reveals our carnality</u> – 14 - "*the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin*" cf. <u>1 Cor. 3:1-3; Eph. 4:17-24</u>

7C. <u>The law Reinforces our need of a Savior</u> – <u>Justification and sanctification are by faith</u> in the finished work of the Messiah! - cf. <u>Galatians 2:16-21; 3:19-25; Matthew 11:28-30</u>

<u>The whole purpose of the law is to lead or drive us to Jesus Christ!</u> Are you presenting the gospel message and the Christian walk as one always leading to Christ? "For the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life!"
