Rev 1:4 John, to the seven churches which are in Asia: Grace to you and peace

- "Grace be unto you, and peace." The word grace is charis, the Greek form of greeting, and peace is shalom, the Hebrew form of greeting. Peace flows from grace, and grace is the source of all our blessings today. The Book of Revelation reveals the grace of God and also peace. We don't need to be frightened as we study this book; we can have the peace of God in our hearts.
- "Asia" refers to the provinces which include Lydia, Mysia, Caria, and parts of Phrygia. It does not mean the continent of Asia nor does it include all of Asia Minor (Asia Minor is a term which was not used until the fourth century A.D.), but it covers a great area of Asia Minor, especially along the coast.

from Him who is and who was and who is to come,

"from Him who is and who was and who is to come" emphasizes the eternity and immutability of God. Notice now the mention of each member of the Trinity: "Jesus Christ" (in the next verse) refers to God the Son, the "seven Spirits" refer to the Holy Spirit, and "Him who is, and who was, and who is to come" refers to God the Father.

and from the seven Spirits who are before His throne,

It is "from him ... and from the seven Spirits," which brings the Trinity before us. The "seven Spirits" probably refer to the Holy Spirit and may have reference to the seven branches of the lampstand, as we shall see later on.

I. THE PLACES TO WHICH THIS MESSAGE WAS BEING SENT - 4, 11

1. The NUMBER (7) of churches reveals that all churches are intended - Cf. Rev. 2:7, 11, 17, 29; 3:6, 13, 22 - "He that has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches"

Seven - "completion" - used 54X; Spirits; beatitudes; seals;

2. The <u>NAMES of the churches reveal that its impact is for all</u> time. The first century as well as for today!

II.THE PERSONS FROM WHOM THE MESSAGE WAS GIVEN - 4-5

- 1. It comes from the ETERNAL GOD "from Him who is, and who was, and who is to come" cf. Rev. 1:4(Father), 8(Christ); 4:8; 11:17(Christ); 16:5
- <u>2. It comes from the SEVEN SPIRITS (pneumata) "who are before His throne" cf. Rev. 3:1; 4:5; 5:6; (angels aggelous) 8:2; 15:1, 6-8; 16:1; 17:1; 21:9</u>

TWO MAJOR VIEWS:

trumpets: vials: stars:

2a. It refers to the HOLY SPIRIT:

Sevenfold attributes in *Isaiah 11:2* (But, in the Hebrew, there are three couplets or categories in the text noted by the words "the Spirit of" - indicating six characteristics, not seven). Others connect it with the "seven lampstands" (1:20) which requires the oil of the Holy Spirit – *Rev. 1:20; Zechariah 4:2-6 cf. Rev. 4:5*

2b. It refers to the SEVEN ANGELS:

Cf. Rev. 3:1 ("seven stars")

Rev. 5:6 - "seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent forth into all the earth" (seven angels sent forth with seven trumpets)

Rev. 8:2 - "THE seven angels who stood before God" (the ones previously mentioned)

Revelation 1:4-11

Verse 4 - "to the seven churches which are in Asia" Verse 11 - "send it unto the seven churches which are in Asia"(Asia Minor – today's western Turkey) Notice: THE <u>PLACES</u> TO WHICH THIS MESSAGE WAS BEING SENT - 4, 11

II. THE <u>PERSONS</u> FROM WHOM THE MESSAGE WAS GIVEN - 4-5

The message is <u>from God the Father to Jesus Christ the</u> Son, through the messenger angels, given to John.

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Rev 1:5 and <u>from Jesus Christ</u>, <u>the faithful</u> <u>witness</u>, the <u>firstborn from the dead</u> (His resurrection!).

II. THE PERSONS FROM WHOM THE MESSAGE WAS GIVEN - 4-5

3. It comes from JESUS CHRIST - 5-6 - Primarily from Him!

Notice Six Things:

1. "the faithful witness" cf. Rev. 3:14 and John 1:18; 8:14;- we can count on Him! He never lies! Jesus never fails!

John 18:37 – Jesus said, "that I should bear witness to the truth"

Ps. 89:37 – "Even like the faithful witness in the sky."

Example: 1 John 1:9 - "He is faithful ... to forgive... and to cleanse"

2. "the firstborn (first begotten) of the dead" – (Greek – prototokos, preeminent, pertaining to having special status associated with a first-born-of
Christ, as the firstborn of a new humanity which is to be glorified, as its
exalted Lord is glorified - Our Resurrection!) Psalm 89:24-29;
Romans 8:29; 1 Corinthians 15:20-23; Colossians 1:18;
Hebrews 1:6 Firstborn is the Greek prototokos, which has to do with
resurrection. He is the first to rise from the dead, never to die again. This
is a marvelous picture! Death was a womb which bore Him. He came out
of death into life. The tomb was a womb, as far as He was concerned. He
is the only One back from the dead in a glorified body. No one else has
come that route yet, but His own are going to follow Him in resurrection,
and the Rapture will be next (see ITh_4:14). Then will come the
revelation when He will come to the earth.

The message comes primarily from Jesus Christ!!

How important is the reliability of Jesus Christ?

1. "Faithful witness"—Jesus Christ is the only trustworthy witness to the facts of this book. The facts are about Him. He testifies of Himself. It is difficult to believe other people, but we can believe the Lord Jesus.

2.(Col. 1:18; 2:9) He is the beginning, the first-born from the dead, arche-, pro-totokos – the preeminent One! the principle. the first-born from the dead; the principle of our resurrection, as well as the first-born Himself. All our hopes and joys take their rise from Him who is the author of our salvation. Not that He was the first who ever rose from the dead, but the first and only one who rose by His own power, and was (Rom. 1:4) declared to be the Son of God, and Lord of all things. And He is the head of the resurrection, and has given us an example and evidence of our resurrection from the dead. He rose as the first-fruits-never to die again!, (1Co_15:20-23!!). (Rom 8:29) That which is herein chiefly designed is the honor of Jesus Christ, that **He might be the** *first-born among many* brethren; that is, that Christ might have the honor of being the great pattern, as well as the great prince, and in this, as in **other things, might have pre-eminence**. It was in the first-born that all the children were dedicated to God under the law. The first-born was the head of the family, on whom all the rest did depend: now in the family of the saints Christ must have the **honor of being the first-born**. And blessed be God that there are many brethren; though they seem but a few in one place at one time, yet, when they come all together, they will be a great many. There is, therefore, a certain number predestinated, that the end of Christ's undertaking might be infallibly secured. Had the event been left at uncertainties in the divine counsels, to depend upon the contingent turn of man's will, Christ might have been the first-born among but few or no brethren - a captain without soldiers and a prince without subjects - to prevent which, and to secure to Him many brethren, the decree is absolute, the thing ascertained, that He might be sure to see His seed, there is a remnant predestinated to be conformed to His image, which decree will certainly have its accomplishment in the holiness and happiness of that chosen race; and so, in spite of all the opposition of the powers of darkness, Christ will be the firstborn among many, very many brethren.

and the ruler over the kings of the earth.

To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood,

Rev 1:6 and has made us kings and priests to His God and Father.

3. "and the ruler (Greek - archon) over the kings of the earth" Cf. Daniel 2:47; I Timothy 6:15; Rev. 17:14; 19:15-16 (all CAPS in 95 manuscripts) 3. "The ruler of the kings of the earth" speaks of His ultimate position during the Millennium. "Wherefore God also hath highly exalted Him, and given Him a name which is above every name: That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Php. 2:9-11).

4. "To Him who loved us, and washed us from our sins in His own blood"—
"loved" - John 3:16; Ephesians 5:25; 1 John 4:9-10

"washed" - to take a bath. Noun - Ephesians 5:26 and Titus 3:5 compound verbs - 1 Cor. 6:11 - New American Standard - "released us"
New International - "freed us". They take MSS evidence to be luo, not louo. 4.
"To Him that loved us" is actually in the present tense and emphasizes
His constant attitude toward His own. The Book of Revelation should not frighten us too much because of the fact that it is from the One who loves us. Jesus Christ didn't love us only when He died on the cross, although
He loved us at that time, but He also loves us today. Right at this very minute, Jesus loves you.

5. "has made us kings and priests to His God and Father". Some MSS read "kingdom" instead of "kings" cf. 1 Peter 2:9; Revelation 5:10 "Washed [loosed] us from our sins in His own blood." The blood of Christ is very important. It is not just a symbol. In the Old Testament, God taught His people that the "... life of the flesh is in the blood ..." (Lev_17:11). In this verse God goes on to say, "I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls...." When Christ shed His blood, I think every drop came out of His body. He gave that for you and for me. He gave His life, if you please. He died, and I am not inclined to belittle the blood of Christ as some men are doing today. Peter wrote, "Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot" (1Pe 1:18-19). Because of that shed blood, Paul could write to the voung preacher Timothy, "For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1Tim_2:5). He loosed us from our sins in His own blood. What a wonderful, glorious thing!

(<u>Dan. 2:47</u>) - That your God is a God of gods - Is superior to all other gods; is supreme over all. Compare Rev_17:14; 1Tim. 6:15. The idea is, that whatever subordinate beings there may be, He is supreme.

And a Lord of kings - <u>Supreme over kings</u>. They are all inferior to Him, and subject to His control.

(Tit. 3:5) — "not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit", By the washing of regeneration - The word rendered "washing" (loutrou) occurs in the New Testament only in this place and in Eph 5:26, where also it is rendered "washing" - "That he might sanctify and cleanse it (the church) with the washing of water by the word." The word properly means "a bath;" then water for bathing; then the act of bathing, washing, ablution.

"(palingenesia-regeneration) - occurs in the New Testament only here and in Mat 19:28, - "in the regeneration when the Son of man," etc. It means, properly, a new birth, reproduction, or renewal

(1Pe 2:9) But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood (same root word as priests), a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light;

(Rev 5:10) And have made us kings and priests to our God;
And we shall reign on the earth."

to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

6. "to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen" Doxology: Psa. 15:1; Rev. 4:11; 5:13; 7:12 "And has made us kings and priests [a kingdom of priests] to His God and Father" believers are never called kings. They are a kingdom of priests and are going to rule with the Lord Jesus. The King is coming, all right, but when He comes as King, He will come to the earth, and at that time He is going to put down all unrighteousness. But before He comes to earth as King, He will come in the air, an event we call the Rapture. At that time He will come as my Savior. He comes as the Bridegroom for His bride, the church, whom He loves and gave Himself for. He comes as the lover of my soul. For this reason I am not as thrilled with "The King Is Coming," as I am with the fact that He will soon call His church to Himself. My relationship to Him is much closer. He is my Lord. He has not made us "kings and priests," He has made us a kingdom of priests, and we are going to reign with Him.
