# V 16. PERGAMOS RECEIVED A STRONG EXHORTATION

Five of the churches are told to repent.

v. 16a It may involve a  $\underline{REMOVAL}$  of the church's influence and testimony

"Repent, or else I will come to you quickly" - cf. 2:5

Cf. Matthew 7:21-23 Notice the change in pronouns - from "vou" to "them"

v. 16b. It may involve a <u>RESULT</u> of eternal consequences "and will fight against them with the sword of My mouth" -

We're talking about the mighty judgment sword! –

Judgment to the "them" for holding to wrongful doctrines.

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Rev 2:16 Repent, or else I will come to you quickly

and will fight against them with the sword of My mouth.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND: PERGAMOS -

located 55 miles north of Smyrna, and 15 miles from the Aegean Sea. In 29 b.c. it was given permission to erect and dedicate a temple to Augustus, reputed to be the first heathen temple in Asia that was dedicated to the worship of Caesar.

The last king of Pergamos, Attalus III, bequeathed his territory to Rome and Pergamos was made the capital city of the Roman province of Asia.

A great university was there with a library of over 200,000 volumes, which was sent to Egypt by Mark Antony as a gift to Cleopatra.

The name of the city comes from words for parchment/paper, or from a word meaning "tower" (pergos) and a word for "marriage" (gamos) two ideas: marriage + elevation.

The acropolis (high city) is 1000 feet high above the city, with an amphitheater seating 10,000 people on the side of the mountain.

On top of the mountain is a giant altar to Zeus, 800 feet above ground, seen for miles - the altar was 100 feet square. There were temples on the Acropolis to Athena and Dionysius.

Pergamos was known for its medical school and worship of the god of healing, Aesculapius or Asklepios, symbolized by a serpent (still used by the medical profession today).

It was also known for its school of psychology with use of a therapy tunnel and mineral baths and healing waters.

The worship of the emperor was very strong -Christians were in danger 365 days a year, not just the one day in which incense was to be burned, by every resident, proclaiming, "Caesar is Lord."

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OBSERVATION INTERPRETATION APPLICATION

*Rev* 2:17 "*He who has an ear, let him hear what* the Spirit says to the churches. **To him who** overcomes

*I will give some of the hidden manna to eat.* 

And I will give him a white stone, and on the **stone a new name** written which no one knows except him who receives it." '

- (1) A white stone was regarded as **a token of favor**, prosperity, or success everywhere - As such, it would denote that the Christian to whom it is said to be given would meet with the favor of the Redeemer, and would have a token of his approval.
- (2) the name written on this stone would be designed also as a token or pledge of his favor - as a name engraved on a signet or seal would be a pledge to him who received it of friendship. In other words, the victor would be assured from the Redeemer, who distributes rewards, that his welfare would be secure.
- (3) this would be to him as if he should receive a stone so marked that its letters were invisible to all others, but apparent to him who received it. The meaning then probably is, that to the true Christian - the victor over sin - there is given some pledge of the divine favor which has to him all the effect of assurance, and which others do not perceive or understand. This consists of favors shown directly to the soul - the evidence of pardoned sin; joy in the Holy Spirit; peace with God; clear views of the Saviour; the

possession of a spirit which is properly that of Christ, and which is the gift of God to the soul. The **true Christian** 

understands this; the world perceives it not...

And in the stone a new name written - A name indicating a new relation, new hopes and triumphs. Probably the name here referred to is the name of the Redeemer, or the name Christian, or some such

Which no man knoweth, ... - That is, no one would understand its import, as no one but the Christian estimates the value of that on which he relics as the pledge of his Redeemer's love. (Barnes)

Hidden manna was in the pot inside the ark Contrast with the practice in Pergamum of eating things sacrificed to idols

# 2B. A WHITE STONE WITH A NEW NAME - cf. Rev. 3:12; 19:12, 16

a. The Position of the enemy

"where Satan's throne is" - perhaps a reference to the giant altar of Zeus on the acropolis. This pagan worship is directly traceable to BAAL worship and to ancient BABYLON. After the fall of Babylon and destruction of its temples, the high-priest of the Babylonian religion fled with his initiates and their sacred vessels and images, and came to Pergamos, where the symbol of the serpent was set up as the emblem of the hidden wisdom.

From there, they crossed the sea and came to Italy.

The ancient cult was propagated under the name of Etruscan Mysteries, and eventually Rome became the headquarters of the ancient religion of Babylon.

The high priest took the title of "Pontifex Maximus" (Supreme Pontif) - Julius Caesar was one of them and was elected to the position of high priest. All of the Roman emperors from Augustine to Constantine held the title. "Satan" - 19 times in OT, 14 in Job 1&2; 36 times in NT.
